Blind Exemption Criteria Bristol

A resident who is legally blind as determined by the Services for Blind and Visually Impaired, Department of Education shall qualify for an exemption to be applied to the assessed value, for property tax purposes, of his or her residential real estate in the amount of \$30,000.

A certification letter from State of New Hampshire Bureau of Services for Blind and Visually Impaired must be submitted with a Permanent Application for Property Tax Credit / Exemption (PA-29) to the Assessing Office.

If your property is held in a trust, you must supply a copy of the trust instrument and a completed Statement of Qualification Form (PA-33). All documents submitted shall be handled to protect the privacy of the applicant.

Applications may be obtained from the Assessing Office and must be filed by April 15th.

Guidelines:

- Applies only to residential property
- Applicant must be determined legally blind by NH Services for the Blind
- Must be the owner of record on or before April 1 of the year application is submitted.
- Bristol must be the primary residence for the applicant.
