ARTICLE 3: OPERATING BUDGET:

Shall the Newfound Area School District will vote to raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the “First Session”, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling Twenty-Five Million, Five Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand, Four Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars (\$25,584,426)? Should this article be defeated, the Default Budget shall be Twenty-Five Million, Two Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand, Thirty-Eight Dollars (\$25,226,038) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Newfound Area School District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.
